

# Getting to and from UWS Parramatta campus



The Parramatta campus consists of two sites: Parramatta North and Parramatta South. The Parramatta South campus is the main teaching campus and is approximately a 5 minute walk from the Victoria Road (Cnr of Rippon and Anderson Avenue) bus stop. Students are advised to exercise caution when crossing Victoria Rd and use the overhead bridge to access the Parramatta campus during peak periods. Parramatta South campus is a 10-12 minute walk from Rydalmere train station, and a 20-30 minute walk from Parramatta Transport Interchange. ## Getting from Parramatta South to the Parramatta North campus

The walk from Parramatta South to Parramatta North is approximately 10-12 minutes. Proceed north along The Avenue on Parramatta South, travel to the unmade path and travel over the pedestrian bridge over James Ruse Drive. Turn left and left again and cross at the marked pedestrian crossing travelling west along Victoria Rd. Entry to Parramatta North is part way along the fence. Alternatively, catch the shuttle from the bus stop behind the library.



**Parramatta Station** is located at the Parramatta Transport Interchange and is serviced by the Western, Cumberland and Blue Mountains lines. Alight here for frequent bus services to Parramatta campus.

**Rydalmere Station** is serviced by the Carlingford Line (mostly hourly services). Change at Clyde when travelling on the Western line to access Rydalmere station. The station is approximately 10 minutes walking distance to the campus. It is recommended you catch the train to Parramatta Station where more frequent bus services to the campus are available.



**Sydney Buses** and other private bus operators offer wheelchair accessible services at limited times. Please consult the bus operators timetable and look for the accessible symbol for these services.

Parramatta Station is wheelchair accessible. Specific station details can be found on the CityRail website [www.cityrail.com.au](http://www.cityrail.com.au) or contact Transport Info.



**Sydney Buses, Hillsbus, Hopkinsons Metrobus** and **Veolia Services** operate frequent services to the Parramatta Transport Interchange during the peak periods.

To travel to Parramatta campus catch Sydney Buses 520, 521, 523, 524, 525 and L20 services from Stand A2 (3-5 Sections or approximately \$3.40 Adult/\$1.60 Concession). Visit the Parramatta Transport Interchange at <http://www.sydneybuses.info> for more information.

UWS Shuttle is provided from 4 January 2010 to 24 December 2010 at no charge to UWS students and staff and operates between Parramatta South and Parramatta North campuses every 15 minutes weekdays between 8:00am and 9:45pm.



The Parramatta Rivercat operates between Circular Quay and Parramatta with stops at Rydalmere Wharf and Parramatta Wharf. At times, the Parramatta Rivercat service may not operate between Rydalmere and Parramatta due to tidal restrictions and low water depths. The Rydalmere wharf is an 8-10 minute cycle to campus or catch the Sydney Buses 524 from the corner of John and South Streets Rydalmere to campus.



Parramatta campus is best accessed via the Parramatta River Cycleway which runs adjacent to the Parramatta River on the Parramatta South campus. The University is continuing to improve its cycling facilities. Thinking about cycling to campus? Need more confidence? Entrance to the Parramatta South campus is via Victoria Road. Entrance to the Parramatta North campus is via Pemberton Street.

Please be aware that parking on this campus is limited and parking permits and parking fees apply. In peak periods to assist with traffic flow, park at Parramatta North campus first and allow extra time for your journey.
